

MAINTENANCE FOR PLASTIC LAMINATE

You have selected General Partitions Laminate finish on your toilet compartments. The beauty of your laminate finish is only part of the pleasure it will give you. With proper care, the surface will keep its fresh good looks for many years.

Everyday cleaning needs no more than a quick wipe with a damp sponge. Our tough surface resists dirty fingerprints, grease, grime, and scuffs. Below you will find the basic steps as they should be followed for cleaning your laminate partitions.

- 1. Wash the surface with mild dish-washing liquid or powdered detergent and warm water. Use a soft cloth. Rinse with warm water, and dry with a soft cloth.
- 2. For spots that you can't remove with step one, use an all purpose cleaner or bathroom cleaner (such as Fantastic®, 409®, Glass Plus®, or Comet® bathroom cleaner). Follow the manufacturer's instructions. Rinse with warm water, and dry with a soft cloth.
- 3. For very stubborn stains, make a paste with baking soda and water. The paste will be slightly abrasive, so work carefully to keep from damaging the surface. Dip a soft bristle brush into the paste and gently rub the spot pressing very lightly in a circular motion. Rinse the surface with warm water and dry with a soft cloth. Repeat steps 1, 2, and 3 as necessary if the spot seems to be going away.
- 4. If the spot still remains, use undiluted household bleach (we recommend Clorox®). Be very careful to protect your skin—its a good idea to wear rubber gloves. Apply the bleach to the spot and let it stand NO MORE THAN ONE AND ONE-HALF MINUTES. Rinse several times with plenty of warm water. Dry with a clean soft cloth. If spot seems to be going away, repeat above steps.

NOTE: Do not use cleaners that contain aggressive acids or abrasives such as Lime-A-Way, Soft Scrub, Tilex, etc.

NEVER HOSE DOWN PARTITIONS. It is very important to be sure to dry the partitions after cleaning to prevent future delaminating problems.
